WHAT IS A ULP?

An Unfair Labor Practice charge or ULP is a formal complaint filed with the National Labor Relations Board when one party in negotiations acts in a way that violates labor law.

WHY IT MATTERS

Local 7's actions have delayed negotiations, leaving the company no choice but to act to protect the integrity of the bargaining process and your interests.
